SEED: Success, Engagement, Education, Determination

SEED AACHIEVE: Focuses on social skills, daily living, and academics through the use of coaches and mentors assisting students to access our college community

SEED Academic: Focuses on academic, career, social, and daily living skills in a more direct manner for students who are goal directed in achieving credit level diploma, certificate, or associate degrees

SEED CTP/Career Track Certificate of Completion: Focuses on providing individual and integrated programming for students requiring a noncredit targeted vocational training program to include vocational, technical, independent living, and social skills training

Summer Bridge: Starts mid-July and runs Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday; 4 hours per day
