PACCC 2026-27 Budget Address

The Pennsylvania Commission for Community Colleges (PACCC) has released a response to Governor Shapiro's proposed state budget, which currently calls for flat funding for the Commonwealth's 15 community colleges. The Commission is advocating for a 6% increase in operating funds to help institutions keep pace with inflation and expand critical workforce development and healthcare training programs.

Byte-Sized Pedagogy: Practical Prompts, Principled Practice, and Pioneering Projects for AI Integration

Welcome to our series of weekly tips for integrating AI into your classroom. Keep an eye out for new ideas and check our Faculty AI Resource frequently for updates.
Week 1: The AI Launchpad

Our students are already using AI, but many of them lack the guidance and skills to use it ethically or effectively for their future careers. This week, we challenge you to lead a small "AI Audit" in your class. Consider introducing a "Let's see what AI has to say about this..." moment. Students can generate an AI response (text, image, or video) on a course topic, then collaboratively critique its accuracy, quality, and bias, and evaluate differences based on additional prompts. Brief, low-stakes moments transform AI from a "cheating tool" into a critical literacy lesson that prepares students for the modern workforce. Don't be afraid to fail forward - your guidance as the bridge between a student's misuse of tech and their professional success. Let's experiment together.


LASSI Lesson: Using Academic Resources

At LCCC, "Using Academic Resources" has historically been our lowest LASSI measure (34.16% vs. the national norm). This reflects students' knowledge of and willingness to use support services. Many students report being too embarrassed to admit when they're struggling (Q7).

To support success, inform students about available resources and normalize help-seeking. Remind them that struggling is a part of learning, and early assistance makes a difference. Share your experiences or stories of students who benefited from LCCC's support services. Encourage that seeking help demonstrates strength and commitment, and that all students benefit from tutoring, learning specialists, advising, and other services.

What is an A3 Alert?
A3 Alerts are a quick, confidential way to notify our Student Support team about students who may need help. Your alert activates a network of support across campus, including immediate outreach from an LCCC Success Coach.

Why Should You Submit an A3 Alert?
Because one alert can change the course of a student's journey. Submitting an A3 Alert connects students to:
Academic Support
Tutoring, Learning Specialists, DSS Accommodations, Advising, and Success Coaching help students regain confidence and perform better.
Counseling Services
Support for students dealing with stress, anxiety, depression, or life challenges.
Advising & Financial Guidance
Assistance in navigating course loads, degree requirements, or financial hardships.
Attendance & Engagement Outreach
Personalized outreach for students who may be falling off track before it's too late.
Increased Retention and Student Success
Faculty referrals are among the most effective tools for helping students stay enrolled and succeed.



Innovation Award

The purpose of the LCCC Innovation Award is to motivate employees to generate new ideas, solve problems creatively, and contribute to the college's overall innovation efforts. Given to teams, departments or committees within the college that have achieved exceptional creativity, originality, and breakthrough thinking in developing new services, processes, or solutions, essentially recognizing and celebrating those who contribute to advancing the organization through innovative ideas and practices. They aim to foster a culture of continuous improvement and encourage further innovation within the college.

The LCCC Innovation Award is given annually to one college team, department or committee (maximum 2 people). The Spirit Committee will select the award recipient to be recognized at the annual Staff and Faculty Awards reception. Award recipients will be added to the LCCC Power of Collaboration Award perpetual plaque on display in the Student Services Center in addition to receiving an award certificate and celebratory lunch.

Innovations may be implemented through the following ways:
1. The creation and demonstration of innovative programs, partnerships and/or activities that improve the institution's ability to serve students and the community which results in improved customer satisfaction and/or delivery of program/related services.
2. The creation or improvement of a process and/or policy which results in time savings, workforce enhancements, cost-savings, or revenue and/or increased customer satisfaction and/or increased safety.
3. Implementation of a new technology application which enhances customer satisfaction and improves the institution's ability to serve students and the community.
4. The innovation is not more than 2 years old at the institution.

To make a nomination, complete this form. For consideration, your candidate must meet all criteria and have at least one recommendation letter.

Power of Collaboration Award

The purpose of the LCCC Power of Collaboration Award is to recognize a team, department or committee that demonstrates exceptional ability to serve students and the community which works effectively together to achieve shared goals, essentially recognizing their outstanding collaborative efforts within the college.
The LCCC Power of Collaboration Award is given annually to one college team, department or committee (maximum 2 people). The Spirit Committee will select the award recipient to be recognized at the annual Staff and Faculty Awards reception. Award recipients will be added to the LCCC Power of Collaboration Award perpetual plaque on display in the Student Services Center in addition to receiving an award certificate and celebratory lunch.

The following criteria should be considered:
1. They work proactively and productively with other team members whose combined efforts have resulted in significant innovations, solutions, and advancements, demonstrating the power of collaboration.
2. They have leveraged their unique skills, knowledge, and efforts to form a powerful synergy, resulting in their collective output. (One recipient will be selected from each of the following groups: ESP, Staff, Administrators, and Faculty.)
3. The nominees have used innovative approaches, introducing new methods, ideas, or solutions to harness their collective creativity to bring new gifts and achieve real results.
4. They model clear communication and constructive conflict resolution. They practice in maintaining open channels of communication, fostering a respectful and productive environment.

To make a nomination, complete this form. For consideration, your candidate must meet all criteria and have at least one recommendation letter.

Spirit Awards

The LCCC Spirit Committee invites nominations for the annual Spirit Award, presented at the Employee Appreciation Ceremony each May. One recipient will be selected from each of the following groups: ESP, Staff, Administrators, and Faculty.

Actively seeks input from team members; collaborates on projects; works well with others to achieve shared goals and fosters a cooperative environment.
• Workplace Culture Contribution
Demonstrates commitment to fostering a positive campus culture; engages in activities that promote inclusivity, diversity, and respect within the college.
• Going Above and Beyond
Regularly exceeds expectations in terms of performance and initiative; takes on additional responsibilities or offers to help others without being asked.
• Leadership and Inspiration
Inspires others through actions and words; helpful to informal and encourage teammates; demonstrates leadership qualities, whether in formal or informal capacities.
• Supportive and Empathetic Behavior
Shows genuine care and concern for the well-being of colleagues; actively listens and provides emotional support or assistance when needed; seeks others out and always willing to help, inspires and encourages others.
• Creativity and Problem Solving
Brings innovative ideas to the table and helps solve problems creatively; encourages others to think outside the box and embrace new approaches.
• Commitment to the Organization's Values
Consistently aligns behavior with the company's mission, vision, and values; demonstrates leadership and acts with integrity.
• Overall Positive Impact
Has a lasting, positive influence on the workplace environment, boosting employee morale and creating a sense of community.

Lehigh Valley Business Feature: LCCC Training Meets the Growing Demand for Data Centers

We are excited to share a recent highlight regarding Lehigh Carbon Community College's (LCCC) commitment to workforce development. This information was originally featured in Lehigh Valley Business, and we are proud to share these insights on how our institution is helping power the future of high-tech infrastructure in Pennsylvania.

Key Highlights from the Article:

- A Massive Investment: Following Amazon's announcement to invest at least \$20 billion in cloud computing and AI innovation campuses across Pennsylvania, local institutions are stepping up.
- The Technology and Trades Workforce Consortium: Lehigh Carbon Community College (LCCC) has joined forces with Northampton, Bucks, and Luzerne Community colleges to create a specialized workforce pipeline.
- High Demand for Electricians: LCCC President Ann Bieber highlighted that the immediate priority is recruiting and training skilled electricians. The goal is to hire local workers to build and sustain these high-tech hubs rather than bring in outsiders.
- Innovative Training Solutions: LCCC is making training more accessible through mobile advanced manufacturing labs (valued at \$500,000 each) that can be stationed directly at employer sites to reduce downtime.
- Flexible Learning: stackable certifications and shorter, more efficient modules in order to meet urgent industry demands.

This collaboration among local unions, community colleges, and tech giants like AWS ensures that the Lehigh Valley is not just a site of innovation but also a leader in workforce preparation. [Read the full Article Here](#).

Upcoming LASSI Lessons

With a strategic Innovation Grant (SIG) and broad LCCC engagement from faculty, staff, and administrators, the [Learning and Study Skills Inventory](#) (LASSI) was administered to over 510 students during the Fall 2025 term across numerous classes and programs generating 32,704 new important data points. The LASSI measures how our students feel about themselves across various dimensions of student success.

While we continue to analyze data during the spring term, the LASSI Leads will share key findings in the College Voice to help the LCCC community gain insights that support data-driven decision-making.

Have an Idea That Could Transform Student Success? Apply for a Strategic Innovation Grant

The Strategic Innovation Grant (SIG) supports creative, forward-thinking projects through LCCC faculty and staff that enhance student learning, strengthen the college community, and improve educational delivery. With funding available for innovative initiatives aligned with the College's Presidential Goals and Priorities, SIG offers an opportunity to pilot new approaches to curriculum, student support, engagement, and programming—beyond normal job responsibilities. Applications are reviewed twice a year, with the next deadline on February 8, 2026.
