New Canvas Features Coming

Changes to the following will be made to enhance accessibility, intuitiveness, and equity:


- 1. Enhanced Structural Clarity

- 3. Improved Visual Clarity and Semantic Structure
- 4. Streamlined Navigation and Keyboard Accessibility

Files Redesigned page (Available 6/21)

The Files page has been redesigned for a cleaner, simpler experience. You can toggle between the new and old views, and large file sets now use pagination. Sorting columns and clearer permission management are new features, but dragging files to move them is no longer supported. Selection options have changed, with new check boxes replacing keyboard shortcuts. Note that preview links can't be shared outside the platform anymore. These updates make file management easier, especially with many files.

The following Image on the next page shows the workflow and features of this update.




To select all files and folders at once, click the Select All check box [1]. To select files or folders individually, use the check box next to each file or folder[2]. Column headers can be clicked to sort files and folders [3]. To switch between the new and original Files page, click the Switch to Old/New Files Page button [4]. To view the files landing page, click the All My Files button [5]. Bulk action options are available when files and/or folders are selected [6].

Split Student Names Column in the Gradebook (Available now)

In the Gradebook setting you can enable the Split Student Names in your Gradebook view. This will create two separate columns for the students last name and first names, making it easier to sort in excel if you export your gradebook. The following will show you how to enable this feature.


- 1. In your course, click on Grades in the course navigation.
- 2. Once in your gradebook, click on the settings gear icon in the top left.
- 3. In the settings click on the view options tab.
- 4. Check off Split Student Names under the Show area.
- Click the Apply Settings button at the bottom left of the screen.
